A Good Job Description

ny good job description usually ends with: "and all other duties as assigned."

This is a vague and ambiguous expectation for even the best employee. I heard a story from one of our parishioners who had this play out in an unexpected way one time. Our friend was the manager of a business and worked closely with his employees. He became known for helping out as needed and assisting them beyond the normal course of business.

One time he had an employee with little family beyond the work family. He was excited when one of the women at the office let him know she was getting married. Then, lacking her own family, asked him to give her away at the wedding. He was honored. He asked her where the wedding would be held and she wondered if it could be in the lobby at their office. Naturally, he said yes.

So there you have it, being a good boss may mean other duties as assigned including, but not limited to, standing up in someone's wedding and presenting a lobby for the ceremony. Make sure this is on your job description the next time you have a performance review at work!

Beyond the professional career context however, it seems to me we as Christians have our own obligations to "all other duties as assigned" too. The hymn "And They'll Know We are Christians by our

Love" is found in our blue hymnal. As the name implies (or states pretty clearly), our Christian faith should be noticeable in its actions beyond our privately held beliefs. One of the lyrics of the hymn gives this potent message of our duty in the world:

"And we'll guard each man's dignity and save each man's pride."

We can think of the usual actions descriptive of a person of faith: attend church; pray; pledge to the financial ministry of the church; help with special events and activities; give food to those who are hungry or sick; and the list continues. But when a person's dignity and pride are on the line, what do we do? Do we take extra action to increase their level of dignity as a human? Do we convey the love of Christ through our actions that aren't on the "job description"?

Nothing is more central to the uniqueness of a human being and their creation in the image of God than their dignity and self-worth. Our obligation to promote and enhance the dignity of each person—each dearly loved child of God—is inherent in our duty as a Christian. Through the actions that go a little beyond what is required and a little more than what is necessary, we show our love to a hurtful world.


